



TRUSTEES' CORNER

Summer Pool Season

The outdoor pool season will commence on Saturday, May 27. A revised copy of summer pool rules stating important safe practices in and around the outdoor and indoor pools, are on pages 9 and 10, and on our website. Please read these rules and you can either remove them or pick up a copy at the clubhouse for your reference. Also, remember to obtain or update your pool pass if you plan to have family members or friends use the pool in your absence. These passes must be presented by an adult (age 21+) to our pool managers and are only valid during the hours of 11 AM to 6 PM at the outdoor pool. Guests must be accompanied by a homeowner or a resident at all other times. You can obtain a pass at the clubhouse office. Please make every effort to comply with all the swimming pool rules covering Memorial Day to Labor Day and also cooperate fully with our pool managers.

Important Resident Practices & Actions

The topics listed below include recommended practices that all residents should follow. Below are some new items and some restated items, but we ask for your cooperation for the benefit of our community's operation, appearance and prominence.

1. **Home & Property Maintenance** At this time, residents should review their planting beds and exterior siding. If there is a need for any form of clean-up, please take action now in order to comply with our governing documents. (Declarations 5.6 and 5.21)

2. **Clubhouse Entry** Many residents have either forgotten or routinely come to the clubhouse without their entrance clicker. Often clubhouse management staff may be very busy or offsite and thus cannot respond quickly to a persistent bell ringing. The bell is mainly for scheduled outside services or in some cases ambulatory assistance. Please remember to have your clicker when coming to the clubhouse.

3. **Recycling Shredded Material** The township's Department of Public Works has informed us that light-weight recyclables, especially paper shreds, should be put in a cardboard box or paper bag, but not in a plastic bag. Also, please retrieve any items in your immediate area that you may notice which did not fall into the truck.

4. **Gatehouse Access Control** Our gatehouse personnel continue to use the new computer system to record visitor information. We ask again that all residents inform gatehouse personnel by providing: 1) A current list of any family, friends or guests that you wish to have on-going arrival privilege to your residence without advance notice and 2) A phone call to the gatehouse about an expected visitor or service person including name, time, and if appropriate, reason for coming to your home.

5. **Wildlife Feeding** Residents must refrain from feeding any wildlife that may be in various areas of our community. Recently, there has been some feeding of deer which have also been picked up by wild geese. It is harmful to the deer in a number of ways to feed them. Also, doing so creates a nuisance for other residents as the deer traverse other yards looking for more feeders and even notice your shrubs. Please do not leave food for deer or any wildlife.

Repair and Maintenance Items

There are some significant items noted in Board approvals that will be a work in process or be completed over the next two months:

- Paint various areas of the Clubhouse including lower level hallways and men's and women's locker rooms.
- Clean any debris in our storm sewer system and complete the refilming of various storm lines.
- Replace common sidewalk slabs in seven locations.
- Complete an evaluation and feasibility study related to various indoor pool roof structures, including an assessment of solar installation.

There is an opportunity now for all residents who would like to take advantage of a shredding day service offered by Wall Township. You may want to consider taking a short drive to the township's intermediate school (2801 Allaire Road) on Saturday, May 20 between 9:00AM to 1:00PM with any accumulated documents that you would like to have shredded. 



2017 Swimming Pool Rules – Memorial Day to Labor Day

1. HOURS

Outdoor pool

- a. 5:00 AM to 11:00 PM - daily – for all residents and guests.
- b. Swim hours for children under the age of 18 in the children's area are from 12:00 PM to 6:00 PM weather permitting.

Indoor pool

- a. 5:00 AM to 11:00 PM - all residents daily.
- b. Children accompanied by a resident or registered adult guest are allowed in the indoor pool when the outdoor pool temperature is below 72, or the outdoor pool is closed for inclement weather (non-electrical storm related) or closed for repair. Hours for children under these circumstances (conditions permitting) are 12:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
- c. No children under the age 18 are allowed in the spa.

2. GUESTS

- a. **A resident must accompany guests** at all times unless the registered adult guest (21 years or older) has a valid pass from the resident.
- b. Registered adult guests must sign in with the pool manager. (Passes are obtained at the office.)
- c. An adult must supervise children when using the locker room/rest room area.
- d. **Because of the limited number of chairs at the outdoor pool, residents who bring a large group of guests are ENCOURAGED to bring their own chairs.**

3. RESPECTING OTHERS

- a. Pool furniture cannot be reserved. It should be returned to its original position.
- b. Cover lounges & chairs with a large towel to protect from sun tan oils, lotions, and/or creams.
- c. Please keep large coolers off the tables.
- d. No person, child or adult, who is wearing a diaper, is allowed in either pool or the spa.
- e. Children in diapers, swimming diapers, pull-ups, etc. are not allowed in either pool. All children must be toilet trained before they can use either pool. Adults in diapers of any type are not permitted either pool or spa.
- f. **SHOWER BEFORE ENTERING THE POOL ENVIRONMENT** (before entering the water). (NJ State Sanitary code).
- g. Do not use the pool or spa as a place to "rinse off" if you come from the beach.
- h. Resident must clean up before leaving. Receptacles are available for trash and recyclables.

5. IN AND AROUND THE POOL

- a. Residents must always be in close proximity to children under their care and insure rule adherence.
Children may use swimming aids at the discretion of the pool manager. No large inflatables permitted. (Pool Manager's judgment prevails.)
- b. Food and beverages (in non glass containers only) permitted only at the tables.

(OVER)

6. LIABILITIES

- a. The rules of the Board of Health and the State Sanitary Code are to be followed at all times.
- b. Any person suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or drugs shall be prohibited.
- c. Any resident or their guests whose actions cause the pool to be drained will be fined all costs.
- d. A "No Lifeguard on Duty" sign will be posted. Residents and guests swim at their own risk. The Board of Health exemption from having lifeguards is based on a policy of swimmers not swimming alone (buddy system).
- e. Spa use – Hot water can cause health risks including elevated blood pressure. If you think you may be at risk by using the spa, please consult with your physician before doing so.
- f. Outdoor and indoor bathing will be **discontinued during electrical storms** and the pool areas cleared and remain cleared for up to 30 minutes after the last sound of thunder is heard. The Pool Manager, when on duty, shall advise when it is safe to resume use of the pool facility.

7. MISCELLANEOUS

- a. Wet bathing suits and bare feet are not allowed on the main floor level of the clubhouse.
- b. Cover-ups, shirts and footwear must be worn in the main floor area at all times.
- c. Our pool management company, Candlewood Mgt. Service, is responsible for the maintenance and testing of the indoor and outdoor pools and spa.
- d. The outer gates to the outdoor pool facilities will be open for pool patron usage from 11:00 AM to 6:00 PM only on days that a Pool Manager is on duty.

8. OVERALL

- a. Rules are for your protection and are necessary to promote safety and courtesy at the pool facility.
- b. Violators of the rules run the risk of losing their pool privileges.
- c. We are counting on your cooperation with the Pool Managers to provide a safe and secure area of enjoyment for you and your guests.

April 4, 2017 Open Meeting

- The Board Members approved the following four House and Rec Committee activity requests: **1)** Art Studio – Films and Discussion on April 12, 2017 and May 17, 2017 from 1 PM to 3 PM (ballroom/theater), **2)** Art Studio – Adult Coloring on April 23, 2017 from 2 PM to 4 PM (ballroom), **3)** Art Studio – Adult Coloring on April 26, 2017 from 2 PM to 4 PM (ballroom), **4)** Four Seasons On The Go – Brooklyn Greenwood Cemetery & Lunch on August 8, 2017 Departs 9 AM

- The Board Members approved as modified the pool rules for the 2017 outdoor pool season.



A Piece of the World

Christina was incapacitated by an illness that had left her crippled to the point that she often had to crawl to get about. This did not deter her from the hard work she did every day. The house had no electricity which made all work strenuous. The first chore Christina had in the early morning was to gather wood and start the fire so she could prepare a hearty breakfast for her father and brothers so they could eat well before going out to labor in their fields. When her mother became bedridden, Christina had to do all the household chores by herself. Andrew Wyeth and his wife to be were fond of Christina and tried to include in some of the fun that would not harm her, but take her away for a few moments of fun.

One summer a new young man came with his family and he became interested in Christina. He took her for walks, brought her small gifts and showered her with attention. Christina thought that she had found someone who loved her in spite of her limitations. She was very happy and began to see a happy future. One day the boy left the island abruptly, without a goodbye. Christina was devastated and felt that no one would ever care for her. It was rumored that his wealthy parents disapproved of his relationship with Christina and had abruptly shipped him home for the rest of the summer.

There is much more to this book than her sadness. Andrew Wyeth and Betsy, his wife, became life-long friends and visited her as often as they could and even tried to encourage her to see them in Boston and perhaps find a doctor for her. Christina had none of it and stayed on the island. Andrew had often asked Christina to pose for him and she had refused until one day he and Betsy came up with a perfect pose for her, lying on the ground in front of her home. This piece of art became one of the great masterpieces of the 20th century, "Christina's World."

NURSES CORNER

Navigating the System for Autism. Resources for Families

The demands of living with a person with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) are great and families frequently experience high levels of stress. A child's autism diagnosis affects every member of the family. Stress is something parents are all too familiar with as an individual with autism may be unable to express their basic wants or needs. The child's frustration can lead to aggressive behaviors or self-inflicted injuries that threaten his or her own safety and the safety of other family members. Bedtime routines can be interrupted by difficult sleep. There are numerous other issues, including the inability to do things as a family. Many parents feel like they cannot entertain or socialize, which leads to social isolation for both the parents and the child. Other issues are too lengthy to include in this article but are worthy of further research.

After a diagnosis of ASD, the logical next step is to find out what services are available. The best way to start this search is with "Autism Source" (www.autismsource.org) which contains listings for thousands of service providers across the nation. Making local connections is extremely important. The autism community members who live near you will be able to recommend convenient services. Autism Source is the Autism Society's national contact center, and is the best way to connect to services in your area.

It is vital for parents to have "Time Out," to socialize and seek support groups. One such valuable resource is Parents of Autistic Children. (www.poac.net) which we at Four Seasons have just supported. The Autism Society relies upon a proactive approach to advocacy by working

alongside policy makers, elected officials and their staff to advance the wellbeing of all living with autism. They work to influence public policy with emphasis on education, Medicaid and employment issues. These issues are vitally important to individuals with autism and their families. They represent the Autism Society at the White House, at the Dept of Health and Human Services and at the Dept. of Education and Labor. Autism Society affiliates, at state and local levels advocate for individuals and families impacted by autism in communities across the nation. Each year, volunteers and staff from around the U.S. convene in Washington, D.C. to meet with their national elected officials and to promote a legislative agenda that improves the quality of life for each individual diagnosed with Autism.

There are numerous resources available on the internet (www.autismsociety.org). Jacqueline Kelly, daughter of Four Seasons residents Jim and Carolyn Melia, is a Board member of Autism Awareness New Jersey. Her email is AnJackel@Hotmail.com. She and her husband, her parents and other volunteers have done a tremendous amount of fund raising for autism. Another couple who has been extremely involved is Marge and Ed Schwallie who co-founded OAR, Organization for Autism Research (www.researchautism.org/). OAR provides information and additional resources that help families. Marge and Ed have two sons, one with Autism and one with Aspergers. In 2007, Ed established the Schwallie Family Scholarship Program which offers financial support to young men and women with autism pursuing college studies or vocational-technical training after high school. It is the only program of its kind in the U.S. Their e-mail address is OAR@researchautism.org. Very little was known about autism when their children were born. They call themselves the "Pioneers" and have done a tremendous amount of fundraising for Autism awareness.

There is a vast amount of resources and support available, yet much more research needs to be done. Take advantage of all these resources to learn about Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Stepping into Armine's home, despite landscapers outside making quite a racket, there is a sense of serene beauty. Although she bought her home in May of last year, she had so many improvements that needed to be made that she didn't actually move in until November of 2016. However, partly due to her own dogged perseverance, and also thanks to an extremely strict work ethic that had been instilled by her parents, she was not only able to catch up, but was proudly the Valedictorian of her graduating class. She then worked her way through college at the University of Pennsylvania. Where she began focusing on chemistry, but changed her major and graduated Phi Beta Kappa and Summa Cum Laude in psychology. She continued her graduate education at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign where she earned an M.A. and Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology.

John, her older son, is married and has two young children. They live in Westfield, New Jersey. He is a successful executive in real estate investments. Her younger son, Christopher, lives in Washington, D.C., and works for the government. Armine is extremely proud of her handsome sons: John graduated from the University of Pennsylvania, then went on to get an MBA from the prestigious Stern School of Business of NYU. Christopher graduated
