

Snowbirds

If you’re going south or west (or anywhere) this winter, please stop at the gatehouse and let Steve know of your plans. Please fill out the “Vacation Information” form so that gatehouse personnel are aware of your absence. And while you’re at it, please fill out a snowbirds form in the lobby of the clubhouse so that the office staff and clubs’ leaders know where you are. Even if you’re only going for a few weeks, please let us know that you’re away. Don’t forget that while you’re away, you can keep up to date with Four Seasons news by logging onto our website at www.fourseasonswallnj.com. If you haven’t registered yet, put that on your “to do” list before you go away so you can access all the information on the website.

Visitors and Contractors Coming to Four Seasons

Steve at the gatehouse has told Chuck that he is getting a lot more residents calling to let him know that visitors and contractors will be coming to residents’ homes. This is a good thing. We remind all residents that all visitors and contractors must stop at the gatehouse and check in prior to proceeding to any resident’s house. Pre-clearing visitors eliminates the need for gatehouse staff to call a resident to clear his or her guest prior to allowing them to proceed. Remember that for frequent guests like children, grandchildren or friends, just notify the gatehouse staff in writing of the person’s name and it will be added to the list of your cleared guests. If you have new people or contractors visiting you, please tell them to use the main entrance to Four Seasons off of Lakewood Road. As we noted before, many GPS systems will bring someone to the back gate off Rt. 70. Instead, use “1 Cooper Blvd., Wall, NJ”, as the GPS address. This will bring them to the gatehouse and the attendant can direct them to your home.



Get Ready for Snow Plowing

BOARD OF TRUSTEES APPROVALS/ACTIONS

November 1, 2017 Open Meeting

- The Board Members approved the following three H & R Committee activity requests: 1) Art Studio Movie: Jackson Pollock, November 15, 2017 at 2 PM, 2) Post Holiday Concert Refreshments by The Mermaids on December 1, 2017 at 8:30 PM, 3) Women's Club Social Concerns Committee Presents Kitchen Tours and Luncheon Fundraiser on Tuesday, May 22, 2018

- The Board Members approved The Racquet Shop proposal for investigative deconstruction of the bocce courts with a total cost of \$961.88. This was one of three proposals solicited by **Anthony D'Altrui**, project coordinator.

- The Board Members approved the Eosso Bros. proposal for the scope of work for a total of \$18,019.13. The proposal covered cracks starting at 1/8" while the proposal from Supreme Metro Corp. covers cracks starting from 3/8". Management was to contact the Supreme Metro Corp. rep to see if he would revise his proposal from 1/8". If not, the Board was approving the Eosso Bros. proposal.

- The Board Members approved the CertaPro Painters proposal with a total cost \$490.80 for the painting of the trim for the two new windows installed in the billiard room and the two inner doors between the vestibule and the foyer.

- The Board Members approved Archway Drapery proposal with a total cost of \$448.88 to remove, clean, press and rehang two sets of window treatments for the windows that are being replaced in the billiard room.

- The Board Members approved the AQC proposal to strip and wax the multi-purpose room and the adjoining hallway with a total cost of \$1,384.03. This was last done in 2015.

- The Board Members approved the Carlson Mirror and Glass proposal to produce a new glass table top for one of the card tables in the ladies' card room. The glass top being replaced was somehow shattered.

- The Board Members approved the Burke Environmental proposal to perform paver work on Cooper Blvd. (areas not previously worked) with a total cost of \$892.41.

- The Board Members approved the Red Hawk Fire & Security proposal for replacement of the clubhouse fire panel and remote annunciator with a total cost of \$5,490.92. This action is being taken because of an issue with current panel and annunciator which no longer receives tech or parts support from its manufacturer.



Winter Activity Schedule

Snowy Images

Winter can be a tough time for photography. The weather makes it harder to stay outdoors or at least harder to get motivated to go outdoors!!

At this time of year you may want to stay indoors shooting pets, things around your home, or going to museums, galleries, etc. But Mother Nature comes to our rescue and gives us a snowfall or an ice storm. Make certain you dress for the cold and watch for ice!

The challenge with snow shots is getting the proper exposure. Your camera is designed to give you an average exposure of the entire scene. This is why most of your images are properly exposed. A very bright snowy scene tricks you camera into thinking there is too much light, so the camera will cut back on exposure. This makes the snow in your images look gray. If you know how to set your exposure compensation increase the exposure by 0.7 stops to brighten the snow. I suggest you shoot another image without compensation to give you a better chance at getting the image right.

A great way to enhance your images is using a polarizing filter, which cuts glare the same as polarizing sunglasses. Many photographers use this filter to make the sky in their images darker (and the clouds brighter) but this filter works wonderfully on snow. Removing the glare from the snow will help retain the detail in the bright areas.



Their focus is on helping provide relief for the caregivers.

The days of a nuclear family are gone and many elderly people find themselves no longer able to drive and their support system is far. Volunteers provide a "safety-net" and a connection to the outside world.

KIRMS PHOTOGRAPHY *Snowy Images*

Winter can be a tough time for photography. The weather makes it harder to stay outdoors or at least harder to get motivated to go outdoors!!

You may want to stay indoors shooting pets, things around your home, or going to museums, galleries, etc. But every now and again Mother Nature comes to our rescue and gives us a snowfall or an ice storm. Make certain you dress for the cold and watch for ice!

Shooting these images uses the same rules we've discussed before - rule of thirds, foreground objects, etc. The main difference with snow shots is getting the proper exposure.

All cameras are designed to give you an average exposure of the entire scene. This is why most of your images are properly exposed. A very bright snowy scene tricks your camera into thinking there is too much light, so the camera will cut back on exposure. This makes the snow

in your images look gray. If you know how to set your exposure compensation increase the exposure by 0.7 to brighten the snow.

A great way to enhance your images is using a polarizing filter, which cuts glare the same as polarizing sunglasses. Many photographers use this filter to make the sky in their images darker (and the clouds brighter) but this filter works wonderfully on snow. Removing the glare from the snow will help retain the detail in the bright areas.



Wall Township honors Post 529 Legionnaires at ceremony

Wall Township in cooperation with the Leadership and Service Academy of Wall High School held their first Veterans Ceremony on Wednesday, November 8 at the High School. Attending the ceremony were Wall Township Mayor Nick DiRocco, State Assemblyman Ed Thomson, educators and administrators of Wall High School, active duty Army personnel, 50 members of the Junior Naval ROTC, 35 Legionnaires and wives of Post 529. Music for the service was provided by the Wall High School Wind Ensemble.

Prior to the ceremony, Post 529 selected a Legionnaire from each branch of the service to receive a certificate of appreciation for their service: from the Coast Guard, **Mike McIntyre**, from the Army, **Donn Ruotolo**, from the Navy, **Bill Guarini**, from the Air Force **Nick Korolkoff**, and from the Marines/Navy, **Bill Burns**.

Before awarding the certificates, Mayor DiRocco read a citation briefly describing the Legionnaires service. Below is an excerpt from Donn Ruotolo’s citation:

Headquarters 103d Infantry Division, 2 June 45
AWARD OF SILVER STAR

First Lieutenant Donn Ruotolo, 0547923, Field Artillery, Battery “B”, 928th Field Artillery Battalion. For gallantry in action. On 25 April 1945, near Honau, Germany, when the advance of the Third Battalion, 411th Infantry, was halted by enemy small arms, sniper and machine gun fire, LIEUTENANT RUOTOLO crawled forward 150 yards to a position from which to direct artillery fire into the enemy positions. Remaining exposed and disregarding the enemy fire, he directed accurate fire, forcing the enemy to withdraw. His actions, which permitted the battalion to continue its advance, reflected the highest traditions of the military service.

Residence: Newark, New Jersey.

Awarded to Lt. Ruotolo on 15 June 1945 by General Wicks, Commanding General, 103d Infantry Division.

(The Silver Star is the third highest commendation a uniformed service person can receive.)

Holiday Images

It's time to prepare for the holidays - Christmas, Hanukkah, and New Years. The main subjects are family and friends. This article ran last December, but I think this is a good time for a review.



This time of year we often see relatives and loved ones that we haven't seen for a while. We want to capture the festive atmosphere and good time that everyone is enjoying. What can we do to make these images look relaxed and more professional?

For candid shots make certain you're prepared -- have your camera ready and watch the subject for the expression you want. If you aren't ready the shot will be gone before you press the shutter. Most holiday shots will be taken indoors so don't forget to use your camera's flash.

For portraits and group shots get yourself set up first, and then prepare your subject. If you keep them waiting you will not get a natural relaxed image. For individual portraits choose a background that's festive, but not too busy. Have your subject(s) turn their shoulders slightly so they are not too square to the camera.

When photographing grandchildren or pets try to get eye level with them, rather than shooting down at them.

I also like to photograph the festive holiday decorations. These often make fun shots and can be used on your holiday cards next year.

Don't forget the rule of thirds (also from a previous photo tip). Rather than

placing your subjects in front of the Christmas tree, move them slightly to one side. If shooting the dinner table set for the holiday feast, have the host stand at one side of the table about 1/3 of the way from the end, rather than centered at the end of the table.

These techniques will help improve your holiday images. Have a great holiday season, a happy and healthy New Year and remember to have fun with your camera.

BOOK REVIEW

River of Doubt by Candice Millard tells the true story of the Roosevelt-Rondon scientific expedition to explore a river that flows from the headlands of Brazil into the mighty Amazon. The story combines the ambitions of two of the twentieth century's greatest explorers former President Theodore Roosevelt and Colonel Candido Mariano DaSilva Rondon.

Roosevelt was reeling from the loss of his bid for a third presidential term in 1912, as a Bull Moose Party candidate. Because he was a man of action, already a noted naturalist, he headed to South America to meet his son, Kermit, and, under the auspices of the Museum of Natural History, explore the Amazon. His expedition was outfitted with luxuries rather than the correct necessities, and the egos of each man picked to do a particular job all combined to launch an ill-prepared group and a catastrophe.

The history, ecology, natural selection and evolution process of the birds and animals of the Amazon are fascinating. The expedition included a famous ornithologist and explorer, George Cherrie. He and the President

became friends and admirers of each other. The group set out on December 12, 1913 on their land journey and began the descent of the River of Doubt on February 27, 1914. They came out on April 26, 1914. In that time, they faced waterfalls, white water rapids, the loss of their canoes, starvation, sickness, drowning and murder in their own ranks. The author makes a most memorable point when she says that this expedition would never have made it back if the Indians of the Amazon did not allow it. They were Stone Age tribes who used poison arrows on six-foot bows and were very skilled. They blended into the jungle and watched this party secretly, never being seen. The explorers entered the jungle as gentlemen, carrying with them clothing, leather-bound books, desks and tins of delicacies. They came out bearded, nearly naked, malaria ridden and starving. Ironically, they never found Brazil nuts, which would have been a major source of protein.

One of the most interesting facts is that Roosevelt intended to commit suicide with a vial of morphine too ill to go on. His son refused to leave him, so Roosevelt decided to continue for the sake of his son. Kermit later took his own life in 1943.

Rondon is remembered as one of Brazil's greatest explorers and protectors of the Indians of the Amazon. Roosevelt's already bigger than life reputation was much enhanced by this trip. He did have to defend his findings when he returned to the USA. He did put on the map of Brazil what is now known as the Rio Roosevelt or Rio Teodoro. It is one thousand miles long.

Although this is not my favorite genre, this is an exciting, enriching and educational read on many levels.




Men's Match Results – Nine Ball 2017 Fall
