**Bill Trepicchio** was Post 529’s chaplain till he moved from Four Seasons. He was a kind and gentle man who performed the chaplain duties with enthusiasm. He was missed when he left the community but kept his membership in the Post. He will be missed even more now.

William L. Trepicchio, 90, Pompton Plains, NJ, passed away after a brief illness on January 21, 2018. Bill was born in Lodi, NJ, received his bachelor's degree in education at Paterson State University and his master's in education administration from Montclair State University. He was a proud member of the United States Navy serving in WWII. Bill retired in 1994 after over 40 years of service with the Englewood Public School System. He was a member of the Knights of Columbus and the American Legion and was an avid golfer. He is predeceased in life by his son John, and his sisters Connie Nuara and Rachael Donatuccio. Bill is survived by his beloved wife of 63 years, Mary Patricia (Queenan) Trepicchio; devoted children: Mary Beth Dowd and her husband James of Sparta, NJ; William L. Trepicchio Jr. and his wife Elaine of Andover, MA; and Michael J. Trepicchio and his wife Jennifer of Saddle River, NJ.
