ue to the nice warm winter we had here our community needed no snowplow service through the start of spring. Our total savings were about \$50,000 which had been budgeted. Also, the roadway crack sealing was postponed until this coming fall.

Upcoming in late April is the ballot asking owners to approve installing a solar panel system on parts of the clubhouse to save us power costs over the coming years. We ask everyone to please cast their ballot when you receive it. Don't allow others to make the decision for you by not voting. If you didn't attend the first solar briefing, mark your calendar for April 11th at 7:00 pm. On that date. as promised, the Finance Committee will have the final information session for those who missed the first one to explain the in-depth financial case.

The Pool committee has some news. There are new expanded hours in April for children visiting for their spring break. Also, you will see in next month's Voice and on our website the new rules and time changes for our Pool season. Copies will be available in the clubhouse. Finally, the Pool Committee is searching for a new pool manager since our former manager has resigned. So, if you know someone with some pool experience who is out of high school please let Chuck Braun know.

The conservation area signs informing people of trespassing violations are now posted and the cameras are in place. Please let the gatehouse know immediately if you see anyone roaming around in that area on the hill west of Deer Meadow Pond. Do not approach or reprimand the people but do call the gatehouse who will notify Wall Police.

Our new landscape contractor has been working diligently on our common areas to beautify the property for the spring. One serious concern has been brought to the Board's attention: since all grass clippings will now be collected while mowing, our contractor will not enter and service your property if any dog droppings have not been picked up by the owner. Already, we have been made aware of a few property owners who are not diligent in removing the dog waste immediately.

A reminder to residents who have concerns or questions about their sprinklers to email our landscape company (Landscape Maintenance Services, Inc) at fswall@lmsprinceton.com and have them generate a service request for an appointment. If you do not email you can call 908-359-9868. Please do not ask the LMS irrigation men who are in your area to look at your particular problem. They are servicing those who have made appointments and are on a fixed schedule. If you have been unsuccessful in

getting an appointment or service, call the management office at 732-223-2289 and seek assistance from Chuck or Nancy. All lawn service and maintenance related matters are still handled through the management office. It's spring cleaning time so please pay attention to the outside of your house. Due to our wet winter <u>mildew</u> and <u>mold</u> have formed on many houses and need to be addressed by the homeowner. Many pump sprayer products can be applied to remove this or you may have to power wash the siding. If you have this problem please address this immediately.

You may notice the paint markings on some of our walkways where contractors are being hired to repair those spots that have become uneven over time. Please be careful when walking.

The pre-school building under development at the back property should be finished construction by the end of April. Solar

Solar: Go Green and Save on Energy Costs

Your Board of Trustees, together with the Finance Committee, has done extensive research and determined that introducing solar energy to our clubhouse will provide immediate and ongoing financial benefits to reduce electricity costs for our community.

The Board has already begun the process of converting clubhouse lighting to LED bulbs to reduce electricity costs. Solar energy, in tandem with LED lighting, will allow for maximum efficiency with reduced energy costs, and reduced operating costs. Electric costs currently account for 2.3%, or \$33,250, of our annual operating budget. Finance estimates that, with solar, these costs will be reduced by 25%. While the Board is always looking for ways to save on expenses, we find that, with a 20 year-old community to maintain, these opportunities are not plentiful.

The introduction of solar energy is cost neutral for our community. NO SPECIAL ASSESSMENT will be necessary for solar energy installation. Expenses for the project will be borrowed from our Replacement Reserve Fund (RRF). Repayment of the RRF will come from the credits our community will receive from the State of New Jersey over ten years. We expect the RRF to be fully repaid within the first 7 years. We will then receive three additional years of credits which will add to our stable financial base. We believe this makes sound financial sense.

Please consider attending the second community Solar financial briefing scheduled for Thursday, April 11 at 7:00 PM. After the April 17 general residents meeting, you will receive a ballot asking you to vote on this cost-saving initiative. The Board is encouraging you to vote "YES" on this ballot. Please make up your own mind and do not be influenced by others.

Don't let others hijack your vote - return your ballot!



Why the Poppy?

2019 is the American Legion's centennial year. Probably no symbol is more synonymous of the American Legion than the Poppy. Why the Poppy?

The symbolism in wearing a red poppy can be traced to the efforts of one woman, Moina Michael. In 1918, she was inspired by the poem "In Flanders Fields," written by Canadian Lt. Col. John McCrae, a medical doctor. McCrae penned his famous war poem in 1915 for the funeral of a fellow friend and soldier, Alexis Helmer, who died during the Second Battle of Ypres.

After reading "In Flanders Fields," Michael wrote a poem of her own titled "We Shall Keep the Faith." The last stanza expressed her idea to wear a poppy:

And now the Torch and Poppy Red We wear in honor of our dead. Fear not that ye have died for naught; We'll teach the lesson that ye wrought In Flanders Fields

Michael decided she would always wear a poppy to honor the fallen, and shared her idea with businessmen attending a conference at her workplace. They were so encouraged by the idea they gave her \$10 and asked her to purchase poppies for them to wear-essentially the first time a donation was accepted in exchange for the small flower.

The following year (1920), Michael's efforts were recognized by The American Legion and the American Legion Auxiliary when both organizations adopted the poppy as the national memorial flower during their annual conventions.... (American Legion Magazine/May 2018)

Next month, on May 24 and May 25 at ShopRite, Post 529 will continue the 99-year tradition of exchanging a POPPY FOR A DONATION. Please come out and support our effort. 

Some of these brides had New Jersey roots: there was Lady Monson (née Romaine Stone of Morristown), Lady Roberts (née Elizabeth Marie La Roche of Harrington Park) and Princess Miquel of Braganza (née Anita Stewart of Elberon). Join us to discuss the so-called "dollar princesses" of the Gilded Age. This will be a very interesting talk.

Recognizing Signs and Symptoms of a Stroke

A stroke occurs when the blood supply to part of the brain is suddenly altered. Brain tissue may either be deprived of oxygen and nutrients or drowned in blood. This can cause brain cells to die quickly or become severely damaged, resulting in temporary or permanent changes to your brain function and body. The signs and symptoms of a stroke can include trouble walking, speaking, seeing, understanding others, or moving one side of your body, and they can appear suddenly. They may be permanent or, in some cases, last a short time and disappear. Doctors must quickly determine what is causing your stroke.

Types of Stroke

There are two main types of stroke: ischemic and hemorrhagic. Almost 90% of strokes are ischemic strokes. They take place when the arteries to the brain become narrowed or blocked, causing severely-reduced blood flow which deprives brain cells of oxygen and nutrients (ischemia). If this continues even for a few minutes, brain cells can start to die. The most common Ischemic strokes are:

Thrombotic stroke – This occurs when a blood clot (thrombus) forms in one of the arteries that supplies blood to your brain. A clot usually forms in the areas that are damaged by atherosclerosis, a disease in which the arteries are hardened and clogged by fatty deposits (plaque). This process can occur within one or both carotid arteries of your neck, but also can occur in other arteries in your neck and brain.

Embolic stroke – This occurs when a blood clot or other material forms away from your brain in an artery or in the heart or some other site and is swept through your bloodstream into a brain artery. This material, called an embolus, commonly forms in your heart and is often caused by an irregular beating of the heart's upper chambers (known as the atrium) called "Atrial Fibrillation" which is an abnormal rhythm. This rhythm can lead to uncoordinated irregular heart contractions, pooling of blood in the heart chambers and formation of blood clots that then travel elsewhere.

A TIA -trans ischemic attack - sometimes called a mini-stroke, is similar to an ischemic stroke because it most frequently occurs when a clot or a small plaque blocks blood flow to part of your brain. This blockage is temporary and may disappear within an hour. If signs and symptoms of trans ischemic attack last longer than 24 hours, it is considered a stroke.

Hemorrhagic strokes are less common than ischemic strokes. However, these strokes, which occur when a blood

vessel in the brain leaks or ruptures, are very serious. The two main categories of hemorrhagic are:

- Intracerebral Hemorrhage when a blood vessel in the brain bursts and blood spills into the surrounding brain tissue damaging cells. High blood pressure (Hypertension) is the most common cause of this form of stroke.
- Subarachnoid hemorrhage starts in an artery of the brain and the lining of the brain called the arachnoid is commonly caused by the rupture of an aneurysm limiting blood flow to parts of your brain.

Risk Factors

Hypertension: Higher than normal blood pressure is the most potent risk factor for strokes.

Cholesterol: High levels of "Bad" low density lipoprotein (LDL) cholesterol and triglycerides increase plaque, leaving them vulnerable to hemorrhage and atherosclerosis.

Smoking: Promotes atherosclerosis, makes your blood thicker and more likely to clot.

Lack of exercise: Your heart is a muscle and requires exercise as well as all other muscles.


Diet: What you eat is extremely important. Add fruits, vegetables and fish to your diet. Avoid meats and fatty foods.

Genetics: Family history.

Much more information is available. There is a great deal of information from the American Heart Association, Mayo Clinic and numerous other resources. The more knowledge you have is the first step. Your brain will thank you later. Next month I will discuss some of the new devices that are being used in your heart.

Sudoku requires no calculation or arithmetic skills. It is essentially a game of placing numbers in squares, using very simple rules of logic and deduction.

The objective of the game is to fill all the blank squares in a game with the correct numbers. There are three very simple constraints to follow. In a 9 by 9 square Sudoku game:

- Every row of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every column of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every 3 by 3 subsection of the 9 by 9 square must include all digits 1 through 9

Every Sudoku game begins with a number of squares already filled in, and the difficulty of each game is largely a function of how many squares are filled in. The more squares that are known, the easier it is to figure out which numbers go in the open squares. As you fill in squares correctly, options for the remaining squares are narrowed and it becomes easier to fill them in.






